

FRACTIONATED ESTROGENS TEST

- 2. Estradiol (E2) is the most potent estrogen and is essential during the reproductive years for regulating the menstrual cycle, mood, bone health, and fertility.
- 3. Estriol (E3) is the gentlest form, primarily produced during pregnancy, and offers protective effects for tissues such as skin, bladder, and the vaginal lining.

Unlike a standard estrogen test, which only provides a total value, this test breaks down each form of estrogen. The results give in-depth insight into imbalances that may be contributing to symptoms like PMS, hot flashes, weight changes, fatigue, or fertility challenges. This test provides a more precise analysis that can aid in more personalized treatment. It may be especially beneficial to those receiving menopause care or hormone replacement therapy.

WHO SHOULD GET THIS TEST?
